Subject: Mayor Report for Week of June 20, 2026

Good evening, Council. This report provides an update from the Mayor's Office for the week of June 20, 2026. It includes the Juneteenth event recap, public safety updates, public services updates, grant activity, and upcoming community announcements.

The Davis Administration continued work this week on community programming, public safety planning, public services support, grant funding, and upcoming events. The Juneteenth Celebration was completed with strong community participation and outside sponsorship support. The administration is also moving forward with efforts to rebuild public safety operations and keep public services work moving while equipment issues are being addressed.

1. Juneteenth Celebration Recap

The City of Prichard held its Annual Juneteenth Celebration at City Hall. The Mayor's Office thanks the citizens who came out to support the event and the partners who helped make the celebration possible. The event gave the community a chance to gather, celebrate freedom, and support a positive city-sponsored activity in downtown Prichard. Crowd this year was around 1500 people.

Based on the numbers provided, the celebration expenses totaled \$6,585.00 and the remaining amount after applying donations was \$335.86. The Mayor's Office appreciates the support that helped reduce the direct cost to the City.

2. Mayor Davis 100-Day Plan

The Davis Administration is preparing the results of the 100-Day Plan for Council and citizen review. This report will give a clear update on what has been completed, what is still underway, and what items need continued attention.

The goal of releasing the 100-Day Plan results is to keep the public informed, show measurable progress, and provide Council with a clear picture of the administration's early priorities and next steps.

Expected Review Areas

- Public safety and emergency response coordination.
- Blight, code enforcement, and neighborhood cleanup priorities.
- Public services and basic city operations.
- Community events, civic engagement, and public communication.
- Grant funding, outside resources, and long-term project planning.
- Administrative improvements and department coordination.

3. Public Safety Department Update

The Mayor's Office has requested a weekly report from the Mobile County Sheriff's Office. This report is expected to begin next week and will help Council and the administration stay better informed on public safety activity, response concerns, and service needs while the City continues working through the current public safety transition.

The administration also has an agenda item requesting a proposal process for a Public Safety Consulting Firm. The purpose of bringing in a consulting firm is to provide outside professional support as the City works to rebuild the Prichard Police Department and strengthen public safety operations.

Purpose of the Public Safety Consulting Request

- Review current police department operations and identify immediate needs.
- Assist with a practical rebuilding plan for the Prichard Police Department.
- Support policy review, staffing structure, training needs, and operational standards.
- Help the City develop a plan that is realistic, transparent, and focused on restoring public trust.





- Provide guidance that can help the administration and Council make informed public safety decisions.

This is a major step in rebuilding the department in a structured way. The goal is not just to restart operations, but to rebuild the department with stronger systems, better accountability, and a safer foundation for the community and officers.

4. Grant Team Report

The City of Prichard continues to pursue outside funding to support public facilities, infrastructure, public safety, community development, parks, and long-term city improvements. The Grant Team is currently tracking approximately \$119,068,000 in funding opportunities. Some grants have already been awarded, while others are awaiting response, applied for, or still in process.

Grant Team Contract Extension Request

The administration is requesting that the Grant Team contract be extended. The team is currently in the middle of several grant applications, and ending the contract at this stage could slow down submissions, follow-up work, compliance items, and coordination with funding agencies.





Keeping the Grant Team in place will allow the City to continue moving active applications forward and stay prepared for reporting, documentation, and additional funding opportunities as they become available.

5. Mayor's Announcements

Prichard Annual 4th of July Celebration

The City of Prichard Annual 4th of July Celebration will take place this weekend in downtown Prichard on Wilson Avenue from 4:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. This will be a family-friendly event, and live performances will begin at 7:00 p.m.

The administration encourages residents, families, and community partners to come out and support the celebration. City departments and event staff will continue coordinating logistics to support a safe and organized event.

Mobile Master Gardeners Community Event

Next Saturday, the Mobile Master Gardeners are inviting the community to come out to the garden at 5:00 p.m. Residents are encouraged to attend, bring sunscreen, and wear a hat to protect themselves from the sun.

6. Items for Council Awareness

- The 100-Day Plan report will be released soon for Council and public review.
- Weekly reporting from the Mobile County Sheriff's Office is expected to begin next week.
- The Public Safety Consulting Firm proposal item is intended to support the rebuilding of the Prichard Police Department.
- The City of Mobile MOU provides a short-term solution to help keep public services work moving safely.
- The Grant Team contract extension is requested because several applications are active and still require continued work.

7. Closing Statement

The Mayor's Office will continue to keep Council updated on these matters as work moves forward. The administration remains focused on improving city operations, supporting public safety, maintaining essential services, and bringing outside resources into the City of Prichard.
